#### POSTPONED SRA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING



Wednesday 6 July 2022 Church Hall, St John the Divine, Upper Selsdon Upper Road Doors open 7.40pm, 8pm start

Selsdon residents are invited to attend this annual opportunity to meet the SRA Committee, Gazette editor, local Councillors and local Police to talk about their neighbourhood. This is our first AGM for two years due to Covid 19 restrictions.

The agenda is attached. All of the Committee are offering to re-stand but we also have one Committee vacancy to be filled – volunteers are very welcomed. We currently have two volunteers for the Chair position. We also have a Special Resolution to agree clarifications/amendments to the SRA Rules (see below). The Annual Report for 2021 was published in the February 2022 Gazette and is available online.

The AGM lasts about an hour, with a chance for drinks and chat afterwards. We do hope you can join us and perhaps bring a neighbour. Current COVID Health and Safety Precautions will be in place.

#### **SPECIAL RESOLUTION**

This is a notice of our proposal, by Special Resolution, to make changes to the SRA Rules of the Association (our Constitution). This is item 9 on the AGM agenda. This Rule change proposal is aimed at slightly modernising the Rules without negatively effecting the original intention, character or principles of the current Rules. The proposed updated Rules dated 2022 are attached.

We have also produced a detailed breakdown of the changes and this with copies of the current and proposed updated Rules will be available at the AGM and on the SRA website <u>selsdon-residents.co.uk</u> or you can request them from the Secretary Janet Sharp on 0208 6516882.

## The Constitution of the Selsdon Residents' Association (To be agreed at AGM 2022)

- 1. Name and Catchment Area
- a) The Association is called 'The Selsdon Residents' Association' (SRA).
- b) The catchment area of the SRA shall be deemed to be that area of Selsdon within the Selsdon and Ballards Ward (SB2, SB3, SB4, SB5, SB6 excluding SB1) of the London Borough of Croydon as on April 3<sup>rd</sup> 2012. See Appendix 1, SRA Membership Catchment Area.

#### 2. Object:

To promote the benefit of the residents of Selsdon without distinction of gender or of Political, Religious or other opinions by associating with the Local Authorities, Voluntary Organisations and residents in a common effort to inform and to provide facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for those residents.

## 3. <u>Membership, Officers and Committee, Honorary Presidents and Vice Presidents</u>

#### a) Membership:

All residents 18 years of age or over in Selsdon are eligible for membership. Payment of annual subscription shall constitute membership for up to three adult members per household.

#### b) Officers and Committee:

- The Committee of the Association shall consist of fourteen members, in accordance with 3a, including Offices of Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer at least two Officers and four committee members, (six) to form a quorum.
- 2. The Committee shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting (AGM).

- 3. The Committee shall have the power to fill any casual vacancy amongst its officers and members, but shall report its action at the next AGM thereafter.
- 4. The Committee shall carry out the business referred to it by AGM or Special General Meeting (SGM) and any other matters which may come before it or be initiated by it which are consistent with para 2.
- 5. The Committee shall have the power to co-opt members to provide specialist knowledge or expertise and such co-opted members need not be members of the Association. Co-opted members shall have no vote.
- 6. The Committee shall have the power to appoint sub-committees.

#### c) Honorary President and Vice Presidents

The Association shall be empowered to appoint a President and one or more Vice-Presidents in recognition of long or exemplary service to the SRA. These roles are honorary and shall confer no voting rights other than as a subscribed member.

#### 4. Meetings and Voting Rights:

- a) The Committee shall meet as necessary at the discretion of the Chair and members shall receive an Agenda and Minutes not less than seven days prior to the date of the meeting.
- b) Committee meetings may be carried out via electronic means or 'in person' attendance. The Committee shall decide which method to adopt to suit particular circumstances. 'In person' meetings are to be preferred.
- c) Committee meetings shall be to discuss any matter consistent with para 2. Decisions shall be determined by a majority vote, which may be by show of hands or by ballot, at the discretion of the Chair. In the event of a tie, the Chair shall have a casting vote in addition to an ordinary vote.
- d) The Association shall hold its AGM in March or April of each year and the agenda for that meeting shall include the presentation of the most recent accounts which shall have been independently reviewed.
- e) A SGM may be called when the Committee deem desirable, or on application to the Chair and Secretary in writing signed by not less than 20 members, stating the object of the meeting and, in both cases, giving not less than 28 clear days' notice.
- f) Voting Rights at an AGM or SGM are allocated to members of the Association only, in accordance with para 3a.
- g) In extremis decisions shall be made by Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary, three to form a quorum. Such decisions shall be minuted and conveyed to the Committee via Email, text message or phone call as soon as is reasonably possible.



#### 5 Finance:

- a) The financial year of the Association shall commence on 1<sup>st</sup> January each year.
- b) The annual subscription to the Association, commencing 1<sup>st</sup> June, shall be determined by resolution of the Annual General Meeting during that year. Notification of the subscription for the year shall be made in such manner as determined by the Meeting.
- c) All expenditure shall be recorded by minutes of meetings of the Committee.
- d) In furthering its object, the Association may apply its funds by assisting organisations which match the SRA objectives. Notwithstanding para 5c, the Committee may by resolution appoint a sub-committee, who shall be members of the Association, to carry out the administration and application of all or part of the said funds, subject to any directions or provisions for the appointment of new administrators, as it may think fit.
- e) The good offices of the Association may be used to promote or assist special contributions from members for charitable appeals of national or local character if deemed desirable.

#### 6 Winding Up

- a) The Association shall not be wound up except by vote of two-thirds of the members present at an AGM, or a SGM called for that purpose.
- b) Any money or property remaining after payment of debts must be given to a not-for-profit group with similar purposes to the SRA, as nominated and agreed at the meeting.

#### 7 Changes to this Constitution:

- a) No changes to this Constitution shall be made except at the AGM, or at a SGM convened for that purpose, notice of such meeting shall include the suggested change which may be subject to amendment at the meeting.
- b) No change can be made which would make the Association no longer a not-for-profit Residents Association.

#### STATEMENTS FROM THE TWO CANDIDATES FOR SRA CHAIR

#### Sheila Childs

Although not born and bred in Selsdon, I have lived in the same house for 42 years and brought up my family here. We have always appreciated the sense of community spirit in Selsdon which many still refer to as "the village". My children all attended Selsdon Primary School and I became involved with the PTA and chaired it for some years. I was also on the committee of Contact for 11 years and still remain a volunteer driver.

In the days when local high streets had banks, I worked in the Selsdon branch of Barclays and we worked with the Village Club to raise funds for local causes such as the Selsdon Centre and Cancer. I came into contact with lots of the local groups and when I retired, I still continued to volunteer. I have been Chair of the Selsdon Residents Association for 10 years.

At the coming AGM I am standing for Chair as I want to continue to contribute with the ongoing work that the SRA does - e.g., the annual picnic (which has now joined with the Friends of Selsdon Woods Fair), the Christmas Lights & Visit from Santa, the flowers along the High Street and the maintenance of the Selsdon Triangle area.

#### **Phil Roberts**

I am Phil Roberts, born and bred in Selsdon 53 years ago and the early morning manager in Tudor Library. As part of the Sanderstead and Selsdon Rotary club one of my areas of interest is in the creation of a local community group that has central to its aim.

In this short piece I want to address Selsdon's High St., and how do we turn Selsdon from a pass-through town as it is now and into a place of destination where people want to come to our shops and not be immediately put off by the eyesore that is the old Nationwide Building Society. We don't have to look far to get some ideas; Purley last year had purple trees and West Wickham looks clean, friendly and welcoming.

Granted we do have flowers adorning the Huxley, the crossings planters and a few along the railings, but we have much more scope for introducing bright colours into the high street.

So, the new Directly Elected Mayor of Croydon is Jason Perry and the Council is under no overall control by any political party.

The new Directly Elected Mayor structures are currently being put in place and the Mayor has already announced a review of the local plan, to remove intensification zones, the reinstatement of the Graffiti Removal Team and securing additional extra Police Officers for New Addington. Joseph and Badsha join as new Councillors for Selsdon, but have both been working in the area for some time.

Below we provide a brief biography for each of the elected Councillors for the Selsdon area:

#### **Selsdon and Addington Village**

Joseph Lee - Joseph has lived in Croydon with his wife Charlotte since 2014 and has recently moved to the Selsdon and Addington Village Ward. He is managing director of a business which was set up in 2019. Joseph has been very active in the ward and has met with a number of local businesses and organisations. He also enjoyed helping out at the 2021 Christmas Market.

Robert Ward - Robert moved with his family to Croydon in 2006. Originally from an engineering background he latterly specialised in projects to improve the safety, efficiency and quality of business services. He is an experienced decision analyst and a certified project manager.

#### Selsdon Vale and Forestdale

Badsha Quadir - Badsha is a successful local businessman who owns the Royal Tandoori Restaurant on Selsdon High Street. Since being elected in 2010, Badsha has been a Councillor in the Purley area but is now keen to support the business community and residents in Selsdon.

Andy Stranack – Andy has been active in the Forestdale and Selsdon area for over twenty years. He previously managed the Selsdon Contact Charity. Andy is currently CEO of Ment4, a mentoring charity that helps young people in trouble across Croydon. Andy is a governor at Courtwood Primary School, an active member of both the Selsdon and Forestdale Residents' Associations and is on the leadership team of Innovation Church Forestdale.

## MP Chris Philp's Report Member of Parliament for Croydon South

Working with new Mayor Jason Perry – Purley Pool and Planning Policy

On Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May, residents of Croydon went to their polling stations to directly elect an Executive Mayor of Croydon for the first time in the history of the Borough. After a hard-fought campaign, Jason Perry emerged victorious – by a margin of just a few hundred votes. I would like to thank those people who supported Jason; whether you voted for him or not, I know that he will serve everyone's interests across our neighbourhood.

As Croydon South's MP, I am now working closely with the new Mayor to deliver on important issues for residents in our neighbourhood.

First is the re-opening of Purley Pool. Jason and I visited the site just five days after he was elected Mayor to inspect the facility. It is likely that some of the equipment will need to be replaced or repaired, but Council officers have already been instructed to work up re-opening plans and budgets as soon as possible.

On planning, Jason's new administration has already initiated a process to review existing planning policies. I fully support the move to overturn any damaging polices, and want to see the character of our neighbourhood and green spaces properly protected. I will be following this issue very carefully indeed.

I am also pleased that Jason has already instructed the council to reinstate the graffiti removal team, which the previous council scrapped.

Aside from the Mayoral election, Croydon Council is now under No Overall Control after no single party returned enough local councillors to form a majority. The means that council committees will also likely not be controlled by a single party – the impact of which remains to be seen.

Finally, I would like to congratulate all the new councillors elected on 5<sup>th</sup> May, who I will work closely with to deliver the best for our Borough.

Hope everyone is well. The team has a new Police Community Support Officer, Altaf Hussain. You will probably see him out and about at some point of time. Unfortunately, I and the team have been extracted for other events in Central London recently therefore you would not have seen us about.

There has been a spike in keyless car thefts not just on our ward but also in Sanderstead. This is where people stand outside your address with equipment to gain the signal from your car key. #### Saving Selsdon Wood - part 3

This series of articles has been exploring the background of the core group of 5 founders of the 'Selsdon Wood Preservation Society': Mr Lawrence Chubb, Miss AM Bonus, Mr MG Sharpe, Mr EA Earl and Miss WM Hudson.

This month we hear about Mr Sharpe, Mr Earl and a local naturalist, Mr Beadell.

The group's Chairman was **Malcolm Grahame Sharpe** (29/03/1868 – 10/04/1948). With help from free online census data, I have found that he grew up in Norwood and started his career as an electrical engineer and

by the age of 33 he was working as an architect living in South Croydon. Croydon was the location of one of the earliest railways in England, so land values in the area soared as Victorians began to see opportunities to move out from dirty and overcrowded London. Housing development in late 19th century Croydon was booming.

Croham Hurst became a very popular spot for people to visit, however, few people realised that the facility they freely enjoyed was not public property. In 1898 it became known that the Whitgift Governors wished to dispose of the area, the lower slopes were to be developed and the remainder on the top offered to the Council. This proposal would have resulted in half of the Hurst being built upon and the rest being enclosed behind a seven-foot-high fence. The people of Croydon were outraged and quickly formed a committee to fight the proposals. Malcolm Sharpe was a key player. During February 1899 a memorial signed by a thousand local people was presented to the Council. A letter appeared in one of the papers, "We are not asking for a new pleasure ground, we only plead that what we have enjoyed for all our lifetime shall not now be taken from us." (more info on croydon.gov.uk)

Following a successful campaign, on the 8th February 1901 the Whitgift Foundation finally sold the whole of Croham Hurst to Croydon Corporation to ensure protection from development and access for public recreation. A pattern then emerges - Malcolm then successfully fought for the preservation of Purley Beeches (1907). By 1911 he was living in Woldingham and he was on committees to extend (again with success) the protected public access green space in South Hawke, Woldingham & Kenley Common. He then moved to Sanderstead (1 Church Way) and was key to saving Selsdon Wood (1927) and Littleheath Wood (1931). Not only that, this local hero also compiled a record of public rights of way, saving them for the future.

He was a member of the RSPB, the Commons, Open Spaces and Footpaths Society and the National Trust. All of these societies would play a key part in the preservation of Selsdon Wood, particularly the recruitment, to the founding group, of Lawrence Wensley Chubb (Secretary of the National Trust).



A more full and fitting tribute to Malcolm can be found on our website from the 1948 Selsdon Gazette. He is described as 'tireless, modest, wise and good'. I found this photo which may have him in the background - if you can identify him or provide a better image, please let us know. (friendsofselsdonwood.co.uk)

Also found on the lease is Mr Ernest Alfred Earl (Gentleman). The title denotes his profession which conveyed status, it was not because he was born from the upper classes. According to a census search Ernest was born in Westminster 16/07/1874 where his father's profession is given as a baker. He somehow had the good fortune (scholarship?) to be trained as a solicitor at St John's College, Cambridge. Fellow founding member of the Selsdon Wood Preservation group, Winifred Hudson's family also had strong links to that College at that time so he may have known them. His family moved to Croydon (Chatsworth Road) sometime after 1891. The address first appearing on his father's death certificate of 1900. My guess would be that Ernest may have become involved in the saving of Croham Hurst (his legal knowledge no doubt being useful) and became known to Malcolm Sharpe at that time. He owned a Law practice at Chancery Lane. London. He is still found on the electoral roll with his Croydon address in 1924 but at some point, he moved to Reigate where he died in 1954 aged 80.


In my research into the 5 names on the Selsdon Wood Lease transfer I came across the name **Arthur M F Beadell** (23/02/1872- 24/03/1957) and he is worth mentioning. According to Brian Thomas (writing for The Bourne Society, Book 8 Village Histories Chelsham and Farleigh), Arthur was "an early custodian of our wildlife heritage", he came from a poor background and had to leave school early but was a talented, self-taught and committed naturalist and conservationist and a "leading light" in the struggle to save Selsdon Wood and whose advice was regularly sought by Malcolm Sharpe.

A Good Time for Gardening - June

Everything should be growing really well by now, despite whatever the weather has decided to do ... rain, high winds or scorching sunshine! We will all be kept busy in the garden over the next few months.

- ~ Check plants daily and water them if the soil is dry especially newly planted fruit trees and shrubs that are still getting established.
- Use blinds or apply shade paint to prevent your greenhouse from overheating. Remember to open vents and doors on warm days.





- ~ Lift and divide clumps of snowdrops and bluebells once the leaves start to yellow.
- ~ Wait for bulb foliage to die down naturally before cutting back.
- ~ Pinch out the tips of **fuchsias** to encourage a bushy habit and more flowers.
- ~ Start to pick **sweet peas** as soon as they flower to encourage more blooms.
- ~ Dead-head your roses if they're repeat-flowering types. Otherwise, leave the seed heads on for decoration.
- ~ Dead-head and cut back **oriental poppies** after flowering. Cutting them close to ground level will stimulate new foliage.
- ~ Stake tall perennial plants to prevent wind damage.
- ~ Pinch out any side shoots from your **tomato plants**. You can pot these up to create new tomato plants. Start to feed once the first truss is setting fruit.
- ~ Harvest salad crops, and resow every 2 weeks for a constant supply of tasty leaves.
- ~ Keep an eye on your **onion and garlic**. When the leaves start to yellow and die back, they're ready to harvest.
- ~ Peg down runners on your strawberry plants to create more plants



for next year. If you don't need more plants simply remove the strawberry runners completely.

- ~ Always water potted **blueberry plants** with rainwater, as the lime contained in tap water reduces the acidity of the soil over time.
- ~ If there hasn't been much rain, raise your lawn mower blades to reduce stress on the grass.
- ~ Use **water butts** as much as possible and water your patio perennials and baskets well in hot weather. Start to feed them with a balanced liquid fertiliser every 2 to 4 weeks.
- ~ Make small 'wells' around individual plants so that the water can soak the soil to about 25cm (10in). Merely wetting the surface wastes water, encourages weeds and can lead to surface rooting making plants more vulnerable.

#### **Shopping in Selsdon, part 4.**


Stepping down the High Street on the even side we see a mix of architectural styles in the building facades above the retail frontages at ground level. Look up and you will see 1930's mock tudor and late art deco vying with 1970's minimalism.

Last month we left, in 1938, Young and Sons (Grocers) at No 190 Addington Road. The OS map below attributed to 1942 shows vacant plot 26 until No 208. Planning permission was granted in June 1939 to Marshall & Tweedy (from across the road) to build shop units in this gap. Work started late in 1939 but was soon stopped due to the commencement of WW2. The gap was waste ground throughout the war and for some considerable time thereafter.

An earlier OS map indicates several buildings on the plot of land around 1938. The pair of single storey semi-detached cottages facing on to Addington Road would have been farm workers for Selsdon Park Farm or staff cottages for the big house up the hill. The cottages would have almost certainly been clones of the last remaining Victorian staff cottages at 240 / 242 Addington Road which can still be seen, complete with ornate bargeboards at the eaves. The buildings indicated side on to Addington Road would also have been associated with the Farm or grand house but of two storeys. We saw the last remaining vestige of another of these buildings, now incorporated into Bairstow Eves, in Part 3 of this tale.



OS Map 1938

The first map attributed to 1942 clearly shows No 208 adjacent to the empty lot. 206 yet to be built. Today the block of shops with 2 storeys of accommodation over at 206 to 210 Addington Road seem to be one unit. On close inspection of the facade shows a mismatch of window openings between 206 and 208. Although appearing to be symmetrical about no. 208 the building is lopsided, no. 206 (Iceland) is a later addition.





Addington Road attributed to 1965

The photo above from 1965 clearly shows the vehicular access to the side of No 210, currently Selsdon Food & Wine. The construction date of the single storey block of 5 shops adjacent, nos. 212 to 220, is unclear but Selsdon House (Retail and Offices) which now sits above was constructed in 1974 and incorporates those shops. The building comprises some 19,000ft<sup>2</sup> of rentable space. Compare the 1965 photo above with a more recent view.



The three shops at nos. 222 – 226 are in mock tudor style and were built by C H Ridge in 1933. They show similarity to 147/149 Addington Road and no.150 up at the Triangle. At no.230 sits the now derelict and hoarded off Selsdon Garage, aka Baileys, which we discovered in part 2 of this saga. More to follow....

Last month we left Mrs Cullen facing a court case as she owed the Council £52.28 from her Council tax as she felt this was the refund due to her for her missed bulky waste collection. I asked her how she had got on.

Dear Editor,

I ended up realising how depressed and worn out I was getting with the whole business. My friends were begging me to drop it, draw a line under the whole thing and move on. They very sensibly said I could end up having to pay a huge fine and I started having panic attacks. So very reluctantly I paid the Court costs of over £200.

Apparently, no-one can take a local authority to the Small Claims Court so, I decided to take Veolia to The Small Claims Court. I started to sort out my paperwork and case, but then I decided, with much bitterness against Croydon Council, to drop the whole thing.

So overall I have paid Croydon Council £52 for a service they never honoured and they never responded to all my communications e.g., my Croydon Account, emails, letters costing £3 each time to send by Signedfor Post, telephone calls. After 5 weeks of having the bulky waste on my driveway, I gave the Bin Men £20 each to get rid of it, in total £60. Finally, I

paid £200 to the Court. The injustice is disgusting.

Veolia was just as bad. I did manage to get through to Veolia twice, and they agreed I was due a refund, and then I heard nothing more even though I followed it up in writing both times.

Even my local MP and Councillors only sympathised with me and they should have sorted this out for me. I am so bitter about how Croydon Council got away with theft, lies, shoddy service and gaslighting.

So, thank you again for asking. I was very grateful for your moral support and sympathy.

A cautionary tale from one of our readers about checking your bank statements.

Dear Editor,

I was discharged from hospital in July 2021and had care provided by Star Care for six weeks and explained at length, that I no longer required care at the end of this period (13 Sept). This was eventually confirmed by email.

However, I received an invoice for £89.50 for the period 18/10/21 to 22/10/21 and so asked for an explanation of this alleged 5 days of care provision. Star Care did confirm that my care has stopped on 13 September and I did not receive any further invoices.

On 28th April 2022 I received an email to say "I can confirm an invoice was generated in error and a credit note is being processed in due course. Kindly accept our apologies for any distress and inconvenient caused by this erroneous invoice. I understand that the rest of the queries raised are being looked into via the complaints route and they will be in contact with you in due course to advise."

At this moment I have not received either a credit note or an explanation

of the "erroneous" events. How can an invoice be raised in error for something that never took place? As agreed by London Borough of Croydon and Star Care. Who has the authority to raise an invoice in these non-existent circumstances? Who monitors these invoices to audit their validity?

I now wonder not just how many other invoices have been issued "in error", but how many have been paid unnecessarily. Will a refund be made with a full explanation?

# Nature Notes from Ted Forsyth Ants and Butterflies

Ants are almost ubiquitous, being present on all continents except Antarctica. Some species have fearsome reputations – Bullet Ants in South America are said to have the most painful sting (like being hit by a bullet!) – Army Ants travel in long columns containing thousands of insects and will capture and consume any living thing in their path, including even large animals which are tethered and unable to escape. The ant world has plenty of variety and at the other end of the scale are the Honeypot Ants, some individuals of which act as storage containers by filling their spherical abdomens with nectar. In UK plne forests the Wood Ant forms large mounds, made of pine needles, which can be home to 100,000 individuals.

Butterflies in tropical areas can be large and colourful like the Birdwing Butterflies which can lead to problems caused by collectors. In the UK we certainly have some colourful species though nowhere near the size of the Birdwings. The British Swallowtail Butterfly is restricted to one small marshy area of fenland as its caterpillars require the equally restricted Milk Parsley. As climate changes it is possible that we will develop a stable



population of the related continental species of Swallowtail whose caterpillars are happy to feed on a wide range of plants. Another beautiful species was the Large Copper, which requires Water Dock and became extinct in this country in the middle of the nineteenth century mainly because of changes in habitat but not helped by the vast numbers

collected for sale. In the twentieth century an almost identical Dutch subspecies was introduced and in the nineteen-sixties I was able to see it at Woodwalton Fen just before the butterfly became extinct again. Another extinction in the UK of the beautiful Large Blue butterfly has a happier outcome. Careful research involving the species on the continent showed that presence of the caterpillar foodplant, Wild Thyme, was not in itself sufficient but that there had to be short turf and the additional presence of red ants. A colony was established in the west country using continental specimens.

The female butterfly lays its eggs deep in the flower and the caterpillar feeds for some time until it decides to drop to the ground where it remains until discovered by an ant. The ant licks honeydew released by the caterpillar and eventually assumes it has found an ant grub which needs to be returned to the nest. It carries the caterpillar into the nest and places it with the existing grubs. The caterpillar then proceeds to gorge on the grubs. As the caterpillar has absorbed the smell of the nest it is allowed to continue until it is time to pupate.

Just as grasshoppers stridulate by rubbing parts of their bodies together so do ants and, remarkably, the pupa can make similar noises though the mechanism might be different. The pupa is treated like a queen ant throughout the winter period until the butterfly emerges in the spring. Ants then lead it out of the nest to begin the cycle all over again.

The butterfly Family Lycaenidae contains the Blues, Hairstreaks and Coppers, all of which seem to interact with ants which get nutrition from licking the honeydew from the caterpillar or pupa.

(Some of this information comes from Professor Jeremy Thomas' book Butterflies of Britain and Ireland. I urge anyone who has an interest in natural history to delve into this book – it is one of the most interesting natural history books I have read, full of detailed information about each species and with many personal anecdotes.)

Treating the comments about Swallowtails, Large Coppers and Large Blues as examples of attempts to increase biodiversity, it can be seen that this is no easy task. Providing the correct habitat is only the first step and there might be other essential requirements which must be supplied. Our Butterfly Bank will soon be covered in a variety of suitable food plants but it does not necessarily follow that we can expect large numbers of new butterfly species – but keep your fingers crossed!

# Platinum Pudding Competition Winner Lemon Swiss Roll and Amaretti Trifle

The winning recipe has a 2-hour preparation time, a cooking time of 30 mins to 1 hour and serves 20 and can be found on https://www.bbc.co.uk/food/recipes/lemon\_swiss\_roll\_and\_42467



#### Here are the all-important Short Cuts to this Recipe!

Use ready-made versions for most of the components and just mandarin coulis from scratch. I have been told that some supermarkets sell lemon curd Swiss rolls (2 needed)! Instead of the St Clement's jelly, use 1 packet of lemon-flavoured jelly and follow the packet instructions to make 1 pint/568ml. For the custard, use 500ml/18fl oz ready-made custard. For the biscuits, use 100g/3½oz ready-made amaretti biscuits. Instead of making the jewelled chocolate bark, you can finish this trifle by scattering over the reserved amaretti biscuits, mixed peel and 50g/1¾oz white chocolate chunks.

#### **Mandarin Coulis**

To make the chunky mandarin coulis, strain two tins of mandarins, around 300g each. Discard the juice and put the fruit into a saucepan with 45g of caster sugar and heat gently until broken down. Remove from the heat. In a small bowl, slake 16g (2 sachets) of arrowroot with 2 tablespoons cold water then add to the warm mandarins. Add the juice of half a lemon and mix well before pouring into a large bowl. Strain the remaining two tins of mandarins and add the fruit to the bowl then leave to cool completely.

#### **Assembly**

Slice one Swiss roll into 2.5cm/1in slices and place upright around the bottom edge of the trifle dish so the swirl is visible. Slice the other Swiss roll into thicker pieces and use these to fill the bottom of the dish, ensuring the top is roughly the same level as the slices that line the edge. Use offcuts of sponge to fill any gaps.

Pour the lemon jelly over the Swiss roll layer and set aside in the fridge to

completely set. This will take approximately 3 hours. Once set, pour over the custard then arrange a single layer of amaretti biscuits, keeping a few back for the top. Pour over the mandarin coulis. In a large bowl, whip the double cream (600ml/20fl oz) until soft peaks form then spoon this over the coulis. Crumble over the reserved amaretti biscuits, mixed peel and white chocolate chunks.


