

#### YOUR 2023 SRA SUBSCRIPTIONS ARE DUE

You should have found an envelope in this Gazette by which you can pay your annual subscription to the SRA.

Thirty years ago, the subscription was a mere £1 per household - but that was before we had to fund the Christmas lights. Even in those days, we were disappointed to get support from only about 700 households although we have almost 4000 in our membership area who receive the Gazette. Last year, we still only managed to receive about the same number of subscriptions as then. Why do so few pay such a

small amount (£5) to help support the work we do in the local community? Please let us know what would encourage you to pay this year, if you haven't paid previously. It could be perhaps, that you do not realise what we spend your subs on – so please read on!

The largest expense is the **Christmas lights**. These are not paid for by the Council and sadly only some of the local traders support us to meet the annual bill of around £8000. Therefore, we are very grateful for the extra donations included by residents when paying their sub to help us. The Council also do not fund the **floral displays** that brighten our shopping area during the year. Once again, the SRA uses their income (from subs and general donations alone) for the plants for the High Street and Triangle displays. Some of the SRA committee and a few helpers tend the displays on a voluntary basis. This year and last, we spent money on the bunting for the Jubilee and Coronation as, again, there was no funding from the Council for this.

Additionally, we give **donations to community causes** to help them to keep going. For example, we are, this year, offering the Selsdon Centre for the Retired some financial support for their upgrade to their office computer system - before it finally crashes and they lose all their records. In the past, we have helped the Scouts refurbish their hut and St John's Church their hall, to name but two other beneficiaries of our Community Fund which is supported solely by residents' donations and surplus from the subs after paying our running costs (luckily minimal as the Baptist Church allow the committee to meet there for free), insurance etc.

I hope you can see from this that we believe you get really good value from the £5 subs and that we make good use of your additional donations that you choose to give.

Please do complete the standing order form that is printed on the back cover of this Gazette and send it to your bank using the first line of your address as the reference, or pay online directly from your bank account to ours by using the bank details on the SO form.

Alternatively, please deliver your envelope containing your household subs and any extra you can spare to support us to any of the committee addresses listed on page 2 of the Gazette or to 42, Kersey Drive, the Selsdon Centre in Sainsbury's foyer, Burchell's podiatry on

Farley Road or Croydon Physio on Upper Selsdon Road. They will all love to see the envelopes dropping through their letter boxes. We are grateful to these three businesses for being a collecting point for us and, more importantly, grateful most of all to you for your donations. Please don't delay - if you do mislay the envelope, you can use any envelope stating your name, address and the amount enclosed.

#### **COUNCILLORS' NOTES**

#### SELSDON LIBRARY SELF-SERVICE

A self-service system is being trialled by Croydon Council at Selsdon library. Registered members can access the building using their library card and PIN code when the service is not being staffed. This will give more opportunities to borrow books and use computers and study areas for those who would usually struggle to get to a library during standard opening hours.

Library members can register for the service at Selsdon Library, where staff will explain how to use the technology. Security measures will be in place and CCTV will be in operation for the safety of visitors. Once the last customer has left, the system will turn off the lights in the building and close down computers and Wi-Fi.

The cost of the new facilities has been met through the Community Infrastructure Levy, which is charged to new developments to invest in local infrastructure, and ringfenced funding from the council's capital expenditure budget.

#### **PURLEY HOSPITAL**

Purley Hospital services continue to expand. There are now four operating theatres working on elective operations. This links in well with the X Ray, CT scanning, blood testing and GP Hub facilities already available. While the NHS prefers people to call 111 to make an appointment at the Purley Hospital GP Hub, it remains possible to simply walk in 7 days a week, 8am until 8pm. Please use these services when appropriate to ensure this valuable facility in the south of the borough is fully utilised.

#### FARLEY ROAD RESURFACING - ONGOING ISSUES

Residents will be aware of the issues with Farley Road near to the crossroads by Sainsbury's. The Council was made aware of the defects that appeared soon after the resurfacing work was completed. These were caused by an underground water leak. Sutton and East Surrey Water had given assurances in advance of the work that their underground supply pipes were in good condition. Unfortunately, this was not the case. The leaky pipes are being repaired by Sutton and East Surrey Water. Once completed, plans will be made for the damaged sections of carriageway to be resurfaced at either Sutton and East Surrey Water's or the contractor's own cost.

#### **Croydon Town Centre Regeneration Update**



#### A Good Time for Gardening - June

Everything is growing like crazy now warmer weather has arrived. So many jobs to be done in the garden. Here are a few:

#### **Flowers**

- Lift and store tulip bulbs after flowering
- Give wisteria its summer prune, cutting all the long sideshoots back to 20cm, to promote flowering next spring
- Support tall-growing perennials, including hollyhocks and delphiniums, with a sturdy cane
- Continue planting summer bedding in pots and borders, and water regularly to help plants establish quickly
- Tie in new stems of climbing and rambling roses horizontally to supports, to encourage more flowers
- Take cuttings from pinks and carnations, selecting non-flowering shoots, which should root readily
- Pinch out the tips of fuchsias and bedding plants to encourage bushier growth
- Give container displays and hanging baskets a liquid feed every few weeks to encourage flowering
- Fill any gaps in borders with pots of tall bulbs, such as fragrant lilies, to add instant colour

#### Fruit and veg

- Plant out sweetcorn after hardening off, arranging plants in blocks to aid pollination
- Cover developing and ripening fruits with netting or fleece to protect them from birds
- Spread mulch around thirsty crops such as beans and courgettes to

- hold in moisture around their roots
- Check for woolly aphids on fruit trees, and treat infestations with soapbased spray
- Go on regular snail hunts, especially on damp evenings, to reduce populations
- Apply tomato feed regularly to fruiting veg crops, including tomatoes, courgettes, pumpkins and chillies
- Rejuvenate chives by cutting the clump down to the base, for a fresh crop of new leaves in just a few weeks
- Water beans and peas as they start to flower
- Pull out any raspberry canes sprouting up out of their dedicated area

#### Selsdon - Population Growth & Census 2021

In the April Gazette we saw how Selsdon has grown in importance from pre-1925 levels of population measured in a few dozen inhabitants, with an explosion of growth with the coming of Costains and subsequent development of the area. The map makers were kept busy with new houses and roads. But what of the population?

In 2021 we all completed our Census returns and results are beginning to filter out from the Office of National Statistics. Some generalised information down to Ward level is already available. In broad terms the population of England and Wales, from the 2021 Census, was some

59.6 million people. In London (Inner / Outer / Greater) the figure was 8.8m. Croydon returns reveal some 391,000 people. By comparison neighbouring Tandridge managed 88,000 and Sutton 210,000. The two main Selsdon wards, Selsdon and Addington Village plus Selsdon Vale and Forestdale returned roughly 10,000 Census forms each. The population of England and Wales has increased by 6.6% from the 2011 Census. London has grown by 7.7% and the Croydon population has increased by 7.5% which puts us in the top 15% of densely populated English boroughs.

#### Nature Notes from Ted Forsyth - Orchids

While Early Purple orchids are in flower from April most other orchids in Selsdon Wood and other local areas prefer to flower in June or July. There are three known concentrations of Early Purple orchids – a relatively recent group of around a dozen plants in the cut-through between Langford's Way and Addington Border, a second, much larger, spread near the badger sett which is off Beech Grove and close to Vale Border, and the largest group of all which is near the bend in the Courtwood Grove path and extends well into Court Wood. A count of the plants in this third group sometimes totals well over 100 plants.



A species which can be equally numerous is the magenta-coloured Pyramidal orchid. It is found in small numbers in most of the fields but a few years ago there was a concentration of more than 100 near the top corner of the car park field. Recently these numbers have dropped, perhaps because of people emptying their dogs in this field and hence changing the character of the soil and encouraging the growth of coarse grasses. A small group of the rare white variant appeared in Field 2. Small numbers of Common Spotted orchids appear in Great Field and have been seen in Field 2 but numbers vary depending on winter, spring

and summer rain and temperature. While the white flowers are certainly flecked with coloured spots the term Spotted really relates to the leaves which can be recognised before flowers appear by the large dark spots on the leaf rosette.



The Bee orchid is probably the most exotic looking of the local orchids. It is sometimes described as being monocarpic, implying that it dies after flowering, but in fact individual plants can appear year after year, though many in a group will disappear and might not return for some years. All orchids produce minute seeds in vast quantities but to grow successfully the seed must make an alliance with an underground fungus from which it can acquire nutrients. When local conditions are suitable there can be many plants. In Selsdon Wood there have been many years with no record of this species but several did make an

appearance close to (or underneath?) what is now the Butterfly Bank. Occasional single plants have appeared in other fields.

The group of orchids called Helleborines tend to flower towards the end of the season. For years we had a single Broad-leaved Helleborine with purple flowers growing outside the Centenary Plantation but it has not been seen for the last few years. Within the Centenary Plantation there have been up to 100 White Helleborines (see my photo) but this number has reduced to vanishing point and we tend to look for an occasional plant in the nearby tree belt.

Since most people find orchids interesting it is worth looking at other sites. On the Featherbed Lane verge, opposite the end of Courtwood Lane, there is a shady bank where White Helleborines grow under the trees. At the other end, near Farleigh Dean Crescent, amongst the grasses close to the blackthorn hedge many Bee orchid leaf rosettes have already been noticed so June might produce a good display of this species. There are also Pyramidal and Common Spotted in the same area. Along the bridleway in the nearby Hutchinson's Bank reserve there are several Broad-leaved Helleborines. The Chapel Bank reserve at the end of Hutchinson's Bank can produce Early Purple, Common Spotted, Pyramidal, Bee, Man, and Greater Butterfly orchids, both Broad-leaved and Violet Helleborines, and Common Twayblade.

The slopes of Farthing Downs hold many similar species with the addition of Fly and Fragrant orchids.

My favourite book is Orchids of Britain and Ireland by Anne & Simon Harrap.

### Bird's Eye View, May 2023 John Birkett, RSPB Croydon Local Group



How many of you managed to experience the dawn chorus this Spring? Some of you may have joined a walk in a local park or woodland. Others may have simply opened their bedroom window and listened while still enjoying the comfort of a warm bed. However, you did it, I hope you enjoyed the birds welcoming a new day (and telling their neighbours that they are still around and to keep out of their territory). Not all birds seem to wake up at the same time. Often the first to sing are the Robins (in brightly lit areas they may sing throughout the night) followed by Song Thrushes, Blackbirds and Wrens. After that it may be a free for all.

The dawn chorus normally lasts for just an hour or so from first light, before the birds go about their daily business of feeding themselves and providing sustenance for recently hatched youngsters in the nest. But, of course, they take breaks during the day and song can be heard at most times, possibly building up again at dusk as they again proclaim their territory before going to sleep. If you are an owl the reverse may be true. Even after the sun has broken through in the morning, Tawny Owls might be heard calling before they settle down for the day. And for them, dusk means time to wake up.

#### **Selsdon Contact Neighbourhood Care - Celebrating 50 Years**

Contact celebrates 50 years helping the local community! Here Janet Jones, who was manager of Selsdon Contact for many years, has recorded some of her reminiscences about her time with Contact.

I started in my role as manager of Contact in 1990. Apparently, I was first approached about running Contact because I was quite vocal about my passion for helping the local community and wanting the local churches to be doing more......I was thrilled at the opportunities ahead! For nearly two years I worked from home, at the kitchen table, all our paperwork then was green and the family remember every surface and cupboard in the house spilling over with green paperwork! On Valentine's Day 1992 Contact and the Hard of Hearing group moved into an office space that had once been the caretaker's flat for the old library and hall complex, complete with the original bathroom and bath (in

which we stored our loan equipment!). It was very exciting times. This move into an office space gave me the opportunity to open Contact up to the wider public and create a team of office volunteers to expand the services we could offer the local community. We needed everything to kit out the office but more than that, we needed people's time. Selsdon responded magnificently and before long the office was equipped and open for business Monday to Friday.

Gradually the number of people Contact was helping went from 40 to over 300. The number of volunteers also increased rapidly, allowing us to expand our services to the community. Everything Contact has achieved would have been impossible without the willingness of the loyal and hard-working volunteers, both in the office and all the drivers, shoppers, befrienders, fundraisers and more. During our time here an assistant to the manager was employed to help cope with the ever-growing workload.

After eleven years at this office, the Sainsbury's new supermarket, hall and library construction started and our faithful old office was demolished in 2003. Contact spent about a year in a portacabin surrounded by heavy construction work, with workmen and massive diggers, bulldozers and trucks trundling by the windows!

Contact moved into the present office (and I could write a book about the meetings and consultations plus the invaluable volunteer support to help get us there) a short time before Sainsbury's first opened. It was quite eerie being in such a huge empty space and the promised cafe didn't open until many years later when the Jubilee Church started running it. I eventually retired after 24 years in 2014 to be able to spend more time with our grandchildren, but I loved my job right up to my last day! Some of the more unusual requests for help we had over the years included "How do I donate my body to science?" – we found out for them. "Can you reunite me with my brother,,,,," A request from Australia from someone who thought that was what Contact did. Well, we did find his brother in Selsdon and they were reunited after 45 years - it made the local papers with the lovely story and photos of the reunited brothers! The range of help Contact offered to Selsdon residents of any age was, and still is, immense.

During my time with Contact, and only possible with the dedication of our volunteers, I had the privilege of starting many new ideas and projects: Contact's first website and logo; Outings – the first ever one was to Birdworld; the shopping bus scheme started in 1995, still running nearly 30 years later; regular coffee mornings; alongside the existing befriending, transport to doctor/hospital appointments, dog walking, basic DIY, one off

gardening and so much more.

We have a couple of events over our 50 years Celebration weekend which is 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> July.



Kate and her husband Andy founded Kate Spade New York in January 1993. The bags she designed and made, priced in the US \$150 to \$450 range, quickly became popular, particularly in New York. This was "a real shift" in fashion and reportedly "Everybody had Kate Spade bags. You could afford them, and happily buy more than one". Young American women at the time also liked the bags' sophisticated look. One woman recalled that the Kate Spade bags looked "mature, without being too adult for a teenager," unlike higher-priced brands such as Burberry or Louis Vuitton. The company exclusively sold handbags at first, but soon expanded to clothing, jewellery, shoes, stationery, eyewear, baby items, fragrances, and gifts.

On June 5, 2018 a housekeeper found Spade dead in her Manhattan apartment. Her death was ruled a suicide by hanging. The day after his wife's death, Andy Spade released a statement:

"Kate suffered from depression and anxiety for many years. She was actively seeking help and working closely with doctors to treat her disease, one that takes far too many lives. We were in touch with her the night before and she sounded happy. There was no indication and no warning that she would do this. It was a complete shock. And it clearly wasn't her. There were personal demons she was battling."

After her death her namesake company which she co-founded, announced plans to donate \$1 million to mental health awareness and suicide prevention charities. The company – which Spade sold in 2007 – made the contribution in honour of the designer, who committed suicide aged just 55.

This is the reason why the Mind Charity received this stock to sell.

It proved a very popular event with queues outside the door and a big boost to Mind's profits. Another event is planned for the Autumn – don't miss it!

#### **ADVANCE WARNING - A22 Road Closure for 6 weeks**



Japanese-owned utility company SES Water is to close the A22 Godstone Road near Purley Cross, one of the major routes into and out of Croydon, for at least six weeks this summer to conduct works on a water main. The company has confirmed that the works are being planned but,

to date, they have not given details about the nature of these works, nor provided information about the diversions that will be forced on the public.

A stretch of road less than a quarter of a mile long will be completely shut. It will block those the direct route between Croydon and Purley to Kenley and Whyteleafe. The road closure will come into effect on Saturday July 22 and is supposed to end on Sunday September 3.

The works will affect the A22 from the railway bridge junction with the Purley Tesco to the junction just south of Dale Road. It is understood that alternative routes will be signposted, with diversions expected through Coulsdon, Redhill, Godstone and Whyteleafe.
