The SRA thanks all those who have contributed to our street poppy display. I was pleased to be able to send off a total of £503 (which was Gift Aided) from Selsdon to the Royal British Legion.



COUNCILLORS' NOTES

Selsdon High Street Plans

Cllr Pollard has been working hard to liaise with Officers in the Council, looking at how we can get more investment and footfall onto the High Street. All four Councillors met with the regeneration team at the Council on 10th October and discussed how the Council will be assessing potential opportunities to bring more people to the area. The Council will be arranging a breakfast meeting for local businesses in the coming months.

Intensification Zone Consultation

The Council has been carrying out a consultation on its Suburban Design Guide. Once approved, this document will apply to decisions on planning applications. The proposals in the document are very worrying as it is planned to build 10,000 more homes in the suburbs. This will mean a lot of development in gardens and on green spaces, and the guide encourages the development of flats on sites where there were previously houses. The guidelines would apply to all areas in the suburbs.

The document also outlines the type of development that can be built in the intensification zone around Forestdale, on Selsdon Park Road and Gravel Hill. These areas would be subject to even bigger blocks of flats.

There was a consultation during September and October, but it was kept very low-key so not many people heard about it. The Selsdon session was on 4th October. This 'consultation' event seemed to be more about Council officers showing residents how intensification would take place in a location rather than a genuine attempt to shape policy.

We have submitted comments on the proposals and objected

Selsdon Recreation Ground Playgroup

Cllr Stranack attended a planning meeting on 6th October to represent concerned residents who live around Selsdon Recreation Ground. Residents were concerned about plans to open up a playgroup in the old pavilion. The key concerns were as follows.

- Taking a small area of the park for a children's play area
- Traffic flows and problems
- Risk of anti-social behaviour
- Opening hours over the weekend

The Conservatives on the committee suggested an amendment in order to restrict hours on Saturday and not open on a Sunday. The suggestion was voted down by the Labour members. The facility will open seven days a week Mon- Fri for a 30 pupil pre-school and at weekends for children's parties/activities.

ORADOUR-SUR-GLANE

A friend suggested that as we were driving to Bordeaux we might like to visit Oradour-sur-Glane - www.oradour.org. The village is twenty kilometres from Limoges.

On June 10th 1944, the Waffen SS Unit of the Das Reich division, eliminated the entire village of Oradour-sur-Glane - 642 men, women and children.

The soldiers drove into the village, rounded up all the men and machine-gunned them, and all the women and children were locked into the church and then it was set on fire and they were burned to death. Then the soldiers burnt the village to the ground and drank 20 bottles of champagne in celebration before moving off the next day.

The French keep this entire village as a memorial and countless coach-loads of children are taken to the site. Not one child is allowed to be disrespectful and if there is any of the normal scuffling or giggles, the child is given so harsh a scolding they become very shame-faced. (We saw this for ourselves.)

Two women and five boys (probably young teenagers) escaped. The two women managed to climb through a cracked window and jumped out. One had a baby with her. The baby whimpered and both women and baby were shot by a German guard. The second woman hid behind some vegetable canes in the allotment next door after she had dragged herself there. She had been shot five times in the legs but perhaps the German thought her dead so left her.

The five boys also escaped by hiding in some rabbit hutches.

Everything has been left exactly as the community left it on that dreadful day. I vividly recall a rusting sewing machine, but what sticks out in my mind the most was a woman who tried to save her child by pulling the pushchair into the confessional. Sadly it didn't work. How could any person listen to the screams and not want to intervene?

There is a film of the people of Oradour, on sunnier days, men and women flirting and chatting, laughing and happy, children running about and playing.

The date of the massacre was four days after the D-Day landings.

General De Gaulle decreed the site was to be left exactly as it was as a memorial. A new small town has been built next door to the old one.

The soldiers who carried out the massacre continued from Oradour-sur-Glane, to where the fighting was still taking place at the D-Day Landings and along the coast, and many were killed. The remainder those who took part in this atrocity were later brought to trial.

Strangely it doesn't feel macabre in the village, but peaceful. It is a reminder why power should be spread, not left in one country's or one person's hands.

WAR TIME SCHOOL DAYS IN SELSDON 1944/45

I was told that I started school early, so it is probable that my first days at Selsdon Primary School would have been sometime in 1944. The V1 doodlebugs were certainly passing over Selsdon with some regularity. The bomb shelters for the primary school were buried in the bank at the back of the school and above the playgrounds. There was an air raid siren outside the front of the school, so you could not miss the warning wail! But no panicked running for cover, we walked out in orderly file led by our class teachers.

Once in the shelter and settled on the long bench seats in our allotted space, the lessons continued. So it was here in the shelter that I learned my ABC and two times table. When the all clear sounded, it was back to the classroom.

Behind the shelters was a corrugated iron building which housed the school canteen. In those war time days of food shortages and strict rationing, canteen dinners must have been a godsend for our mums. Unfortunately I was a very fussy eater and whilst my older brother had canteen dinners, I hated them, especially the boiled beetroot with the Monday salad.

With the food shortages we could not leave the table or get the tasty pud, always jam tart with artificial cream (yum yum!), until we had eaten every scrap. So on most days I would sit there during the whole dinner break, obstinately looking at the plate and refusing to eat any of it.

Eventually I won the standoff and my Mum had the additional chores of coming to school each mid-morning to take me home, making my dinner and then returning me for the afternoon lessons. Virtually every school day I had egg and chips, but eggs were rationed. Where you might wonder did the eggs come from? Let me explain.

In a previous article I mentioned the "back fields". There was a very elderly gent named Mr Hewitt who owned a smallholding in Ashen Vale. He kept some chickens but needed food for them so that they could continue to lay eggs. And the eggs were his main or probably only income. It was a government policy to provide pig bins so that all waste food: stale bread, potato peelings, food slops, etc, could be collected and fed to

It was always rumoured (and true) that there was a lot of off-record and under-the-counter dealing going on – if you had the means to do the trade at inflated prices. There was one very poor family in Abbey Road who did not have the wherewithal to feed the hungry children and I often saw their son, who was in my class at school, rummaging through and eating stale bread from the pig bin near our house. These were hard times, very hard for some.

But I digress - back to school.

All this walking back and forth to school soon wore out our leather-soled shoes. I lived close to the school, but children were expected, and did, walk up to 3 miles to school. Over 3 miles and you could get a free bus pass, but there were very few buses and very few routes. So for most it was a case of walking. Shoes and clothes could only be bought with limited clothing coupons, so recycling was the norm. Cardboard was used as insoles to extend the life of worn out shoes, and we all wore hand-me-down clothes. My brother was three years older than me so his clothes were much too large and illfitting. However I do remember the pleasure of my first day at school. My Mum had bought the material (fewer coupons needed) to make my Selsdon School uniform blazer, complete with its buttons and light blue taped edging, plus some grey flannel trousers that actually fitted me. Then Cecil Ireland, Selsdon's gents' outfitters, had supplied the finishing touches - a Selsdon School cap and tie. How proud I was on my first day at school!

On another memorable sunny summer's day I was going home with my Mum for my lunchtime egg and chips, when only a few doors down from home, we heard the roar of an aircraft engine. Not unusual in wartime with three airfields close by - Kenley, Croydon and Biggin Hill - but this was very low, skimming the roof tops. Looking up we saw a camouflaged, single engine plane with large, German insignia on fuselage and wings. We could clearly see the pilot and crewman seated behind him. The crewman was staring down at us.

"Run," screamed my Mum, but by then the plane was roaring past us and disappearing into the distance.

Looking back, and bearing in mind that this would have been around the time of the D-Day landings, this plane was probably on a reconnaissance mission so we were in no danger. But not many of us got that close to a Luftwaffe plane at full song!

We recently held a special dinner to celebrate our 40th year of existence. A special occasion because in addition we welcomed once more our friends from the Rotary Club of Heiloo (near Amsterdam). Over 100 members, past and present, friends and colleagues from neighbouring Rotary Clubs joined us. Our Dutch friends left with us a large tureen filled with wooden tulips, which were distributed amongst those present together with a computer device to assist a joint fundraising process. Much to everyone's pleasant surprise, the numbers attending increased each year, culminating in about three dozen in 2016. At that time, Christopher handed over the organising to the capable hands of Jill Maynard (née Seelig). In view of the increasing popularity of this event, Jill masterminded the change of venue to the Farleigh Golf Club. The numbers this year were slightly down. Many regulars had other commitments; a few had moved into residential homes. Others could not make the journey due to health or mobility problems. For this reason neither David Hughes nor Michael J. The general hubbub increased as reminiscences abounded and long-standing friendships of more than seventy years were renewed with much pleasure. 

FOOTBALL HAS COME HOME: SELSDON DOCTOR WINS THE WORLD CUP

This was said to be the summer that England once again fell in love with the national football team. But while the England team lost out in the semi-finals of the World Cup the Great Britain Medical Football team went two steps further by winning the 'Doctors World cup' in Prague.

The world Championship of medical football teams is a yearly event in which 22 teams made up entirely of doctors from around the world compete to lift the Morell Cup. The Great

Britain squad comprised 25 players from the length and breadth of Britain, selected by two gruelling trials. It included doctors from foundation training level all the way up to consultants.

Local Farley Road Medical Practice GP, Dr Louis Akindele, has represented the side since 2010. Having lost two finals and two semi-finals this was the first time he had managed to win the competition. Selsdon local boy Dr Jamie Thoroughgood has captained the side for the last two years.

The competition began for team GB with a 4-0 victory over Ireland that was much harder fought than the score line suggests - two headed goals from Nottingham GP Jez Griffiths against the run of play in the first half swinging the match drastically. The second match was against Hungary, one of the favourites for the competition. Over a physically and tactically exhausting 80 minutes team GB won 1-0 with a late winner by Foundation doctor Guy Ansah-Palmer. The

final group match against Lithuania was slightly more comfortable and GB won this 3-1 ensuring they topped the group.

The knockout stages approached and GB were drawn against Ukraine. They got off to a blistering start and led 2-0 at the end of the first half. However the Prague summer heat and skilful Ukrainian ball retention began to sap their energy. Ukraine managed to score twice to draw level and send the game to penalties.



As the tension mounted to an almost heart-stopping level throughout the shootout, Dr Louis Akindele stepped up to take the 6th penalty and, with the sangfroid of a footballing James Bond, he converted it. Goalkeeper and surgical trainee Ash Patel became the hero with the saves to send GB into the semi-finals

Hungary had beaten Australia 1-0 in the quarterfinal. However, an appeal found that they had fielded an ineligible player, a dentist! Australia thus went through to face GB. The effects of playing four games in five days began to show on both sides but GB again won out 1-0 with a well-worked team goal leading to a goal line tap in for Foundation trainee doctor Sammy Bzeu late in the game.



The final would pit GB against hosts and favourites the Czech Republic. Having entered the competition five times, the Czechs had made the final five times and had won the tournament in the three previous years. Despite the formidable opposition, GB managed to run out 2-0 winners, superb goals from Guy Ansah-Palmer and Dave Edwards breaking the Czech resolve. The team celebrated on the pitch singing 'It's coming home' as they were drenched in champagne.

In the beautiful settings of the Palace Zofin on the banks of the Vltava river in Prague, Captain Dr Jamie Thoroughgood and Head Coach Daniel Collins were presented with the World Championship trophy. The win was celebrated through the night by the team. Two days later however the 25 doctors involved were all back in the UK and working for the NHS - forgetting their dreams of being footballers for another year at least.



NATURE NOTES FUNGI IN SELSDON WOOD IN 2018

Early in the year both St George's Mushroom and Warted Amanaita were found. In June we found a new fungus for Selsdon Wood – the relatively rare Oak Polypore – three specimens of which were growing on a pile of oak logs in West Gorse. During August Tony Flecchia photographed a Chicken of the Woods in Broad Walk, and another one earlier in the year was growing on a Yew tree in Court Wood. A Dryad's Saddle had returned to the usual tree stump in Stevens Walk. The strange weather this year with prolonged hot conditions and very little rain (even the thunderstorms did not last long enough to make much difference) is not really what we want to produce an abundance of fungi.

A hunt for fungi in the middle of August had some success with finds of one small Beefsteak in Noakes Way and a larger one in Langford's Way, one Shaggy Bracket low down in West Gorse and another high up on a tree in Bluebell grove, Blushing Brackets, Willow Shield, Collared Parachutes and a couple of Scarletina Boletes which had obviously provided a meal for hungry slugs. In Stevens Walk many Chicken of the Woods were found on one log.

During September Sulphur Tuft became abundant and Turkeytail and Blushing Brackets seemed to be multiplying throughout the wood. A crowd of Fairy Inkcaps occupied the base of a tree. A short fallen branch had a crop of very young (and therefore very tiny) Green Elfcup fungi. A fine display of Oyster fungi was found in Stevens Walk. Tony added Black Bulgar and Silvery Porecrust to the list while I found three young specimens of what may be a Parasol-type mushroom, plus Common Earthball and Dead Moll's Fingers. Both Sepia and Larch Boletes were found but were damaged by slugs.

With the continuing dry weather many of the softer fungi

lasted only a few days so we approached the fungus walk in early October wondering if we would have anything to show. A visit to Littleheath, which appears to retain more moisture than does Selsdon Wood, did find a few cap-and-stem fungi in small numbers but the effect of the dry weather was shown in the absence of several species we would expect at this time of the year. However, Jane Mclauchlin, who was leading this walk, found a specimen of a tiny brown mushroom which grows inside the old husks of Sweet Chestnuts. This is usually considered to be rare but Jane suggested that was because people did not spend time looking for it. The next day was a workday in Selsdon Wood so we took the opportunity to look for the new fungus and managed to find two specimens in Bluebell Walk. Later, while planning the route for the fungus walk, I found another specimen in Greenhill Way, supporting Jane's idea that it was more common than the books suggest.

Rain finally arrived on the day of the walk, too late to have any effect so our final total of 47 species contained very few cap-and-stem fungi, though we did find a group of Ochre Brittlegills, a crowd of Shaggy Scalycaps, and towards the end of the walk added another new species for the wood – the thick black Glue Crust on a fallen twig. As rainy weather comes in we would expect more fungi to appear, perhaps waxcaps, but fungi do not have to fruit every year and their appearance is very weather dependent. There are however several species which usually fruit in winter or spring so do not stop looking!

I add that I have been away. Reminded by my comment. Sellis then informs me about the trouble with the Council's new waste bins system.

Now any reasonable person would surely welcome any effort to reduce landfill and particularly plastic which appears to be suffocating our oceans and rivers . However, the flood of some 200,000 new bins in the Borough stand like myriad sentinels on street frontages. From the outside, it does appear that some detailed pre-planning fell short. Many streets have been granted exemption as properties do not have sufficient frontage space. Some properties in Forestdale qualify as such.

The inauguration of the system also had problems. This was because the old and new system replicated the previous week. Thus the wrong bins were put out and this confused the bin men even more. Sellis was just one resident who failed to study a circulated information pack beforehand. Where's Your Bin indeed.



Julie in AC [RSPB], who delivers our Gazette, had actually seen one attack a bird in her garden. I always thought that pigeon small feather remains were due to foxes. Our garden in recent times is almost devoid of birds and for the first time I found a half-eaten pigeon in our garden and a day later a complete dead pigeon under garden furniture. There seems to be a sparrowhawk menace around here!

I wonder whether sparrowhawks have been seen in the Nature Reserve?

Editor's Note - Please let us know of any other sightings of sparrowhawks in the area - and do send photos if you have any. Our natural history expert Ted Forsyth reports that: "A female sparrowhawk will certainly take a woodpigeon and many of the feather piles probably come from them. A complete carcass probably suggests the bird was disturbed before it could dine! Sparrowhawks do breed in Selsdon Wood, Littleheath and Kingswood so there are plenty around to keep the pigeon population from getting too large."

will be aggressive to others it is ENTIRELY YOUR responsibility to ensure that your dog is on a lead at ALL times.

We are spoilt to have such a beautiful space on our doorstep, and most users of the woods act responsibly and there are a lot of people who travel from outside the area for this reason. Please could we ALL show consideration for others to ensure that it remains as such for all.

Response from Customer Services Contact Centre 8th October - Dear Miss Prigg, Thank you for your email , apologies for the delay in response. Unfortunately , if your boxes have not been collected , you will need to take them to your local recycling centres or you will need to book a bulky waste collection to have them removed. Apologies for the inconvenience caused.

Reply 8th **October** - I am sorry but that is just not good enough, you sent out an email promising that they would be collected and they haven't. I didn't want to have four wheelie bins cluttering up my driveway in place of the old boxes, which I have room for indoors, so the bare minimum you

should do is keep your promises and collect the old boxes or come and collect the wheelie bins, that I don't want, so that I can carry on using the small bins. They dustmen come every week and thoughtfully leave the wheelie bins spread across my drive so that I can't drive on to it, so why can't they collect them.

Follow up 10th **October** - Thank you for your non-response to my last email, I guess that you have chosen to ignore the issue raised. There are a lot of bins in my local area that are still out that you have decided not to collect, let we remind you that we all pay our council tax and have as much right to the promised council services that have not been delivered. I will now be looking at ways to pursue this matter as it is a totally unacceptable scenario that has been forced upon us by an inept council.

Message from Councillor Helen Pollard 10th October - Hi Heather, We have had many complaints about the new bins but this is a new one! It is disappointing that the Council thinks it is OK to promise something and then not carry it out. Even more disappointing that they then do nothing about it. They should be ensuring the contractor delivers the service that has been agreed, not just giving up on enforcement and leaving the resident to pick up the pieces. I have reported the issue to the Council and I hope they see sense and collect the bins from Miss Prigg's property. I am happy if you want to use any text from this email. If I get a response from the Council I will forward it to you. Kind regards Helen
