The London Wildlife Trust has a Green Flag for Hutchinson's Bank and Croydon Council have been awarded two Green Flags for Wandle Park and Happy Valley.

Selsdon is very lucky to have Friends Groups keeping our woods in such good condition: the Friends of Kings Wood, the Friends of Littleheath Woods, the Friends of Selsdon Wood and the Sanderstead Plantation Planters. They are always in need of helping hands or new membership to help fund their work. Details for all can be found on the last page of the Gazette.

Grant

Selsdon has been selected to be one of the areas in Croydon to receive a grant of £90,000 from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund to improve its centre. The SRA met with Council officers in August to discuss ideas and suggestions which had to be submitted by September. We have asked for new signage to the local woods and green spaces so that more people can be directed to these sites and enjoy them. To improve the 'Greening'

of the community centre of Selsdon, the triangle area has been targeted, with requests for the lower branches of the trees on the triangle to be cut to let more light into that area and for the border hedge to be reduced in width. We await costing to see if more can be done.

COUNCILLORS' NOTES

CAR PARKING IN CROYDON

On Tuesday 23 July 2024, Croydon Council switched off the pay & display machines in local and district centres where they had free 1-hour machines.

The council's new parking charges offer a balanced approach for parking, taking into consideration all vehicle types, while still recognising the environmental impacts of vehicles, and retains the emission-based parking charges for on-street parking. With the changing vehicle fleet since 2019, the uptake of electric vehicles has increased and as such the council has reviewed the discount offer for this vehicle type.

The discount offer now more fairly reflects the vehicles parking on the borough's streets, while not penalising less efficient vehicles that are often used by those that are less likely to be able to upgrade their vehicle.

The new policy will see shoppers benefit from one hour's free parking at district and local centres. The maximum stay has increased to two hours, with reduced fees for the second hour, encouraging residents to enjoy more time at their local shops. The no return period at all on-street parking spaces will be standardised to two hours.

UK SHARED PROSPERITY FUND

Last year Croydon Council confirmed that they would be allocated money (+£500k) from the Government's UK Shared Prosperity Fund, this will mean that over the next three years, work will be carried out to support local businesses and help our high streets. As part of this work, Selsdon has been selected for community regeneration, together with London Road (West Croydon), Purley, Thornton Heath and New Addington. An engagement meeting was arranged with representatives of Residents' Associations and Friends Groups active in the Selsdon area, to introduce the UKSPF, to discuss project opportunities in Selsdon and gain their feedback. A £90k budget has been allocated with a financial year deadline.

MP Natasha Irons' Report Member of Parliament for Croydon East

Dear Selsdon,

It is an incredible privilege to be elected as your new Member of Parliament. As you'll be aware, boundary changes at the last election mean that Selsdon is now part of the newly formed Croydon East constituency, which also covers Addiscombe, Shirley, Addington Village, New Addington and a section of South Norwood called Woodside. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank my predecessor, Chris Philp MP, for his service to this community and hope that I can continue to be the accessible MP he was.

For those of you I have not yet had the opportunity to meet, I was (until recently) a local councillor in Merton, where I was also Cabinet Member for Local Environment. This role included working on upgrading council play parks, protecting green spaces with initiatives to improve biodiversity,

getting more investment into key services like waste and launching a scheme to fund community projects that focused on local climate action. I am also the mum of two boys aged 3 and 9 and married to a man who deserves a medal.


Since being elected in July, I have been busy setting up our constituency office and recruiting staff to help run things effectively. Like a lot of the new intake of MPs, I have not yet been given an office in Parliament - which has meant a lot of us having to perch in corridors. There has been a huge amount of correspondence to respond to and I am having to prioritise the most urgent cases, so please bear with me if my response to any enquiry is delayed in these first few weeks.

As a new MP and being new to Selsdon, I am keen to speak to as many residents as possible to ensure I am focusing on the issues that matter most to you. Whether that's making the small businesses on our high street get the support that they need, or that our green spaces continue to thrive for future generations, I want to work with you to protect the unique character of Selsdon. I am hoping to hold a local coffee morning for Selsdon residents in the coming weeks and if you are a member



Good Time for Gardening – September



Summer's hopefully not quite over and September can bring high temperatures and dry days, so don't pack the watering can away just yet! As well as harvesting crops, keeping your grass in tip-top condition and continuing with weeding, there

are many other September gardening jobs to keep you busy. Here's a few garden tasks for September:

The lawn

- The rate of grass growth is dependent on the weather and a warm September will mean you'll still be needing to mow the grass regularly.
- Keep on top of watering your grass, especially if you've sown grass seed or laid new turf.
- Continue to keep weeds in check. Depending on the size of your lawn you can hand weed or use a spot weedkiller. Keeping your lawn healthy and well-watered is the best defence against weeds
- You can give any worn-out grassy areas a refresh by watering, applying an autumn lawn feed and over-seeding if necessary.

The garden

- Growing pumpkins or squash? They
 won't be ready to harvest just yet, but
 you can help to boost their growth by
 removing any leaves that are shading the
 fruit, covering them with a thick blanket
 on cooler nights and fertilising the plants.
- Don't stop watering! If rainfall is sparse, keep watering potted plants and vegetables.
- September is the time for many crops to be harvested. Onions, apples, pears, cucumbers, beans, raspberries, cherry tomatoes, courgettes and potatoes can be picked now.



A novel way to grow pumpkins

- Divide clumps of perennials that have finished flowering like bleeding hearts, lily of the valley, day lilies and peonies. You can also lift and divide large lavender plants by cutting the root ball into two.
- Plant colourful autumn containers to keep your garden looking beautiful.
- If you have a pond, September is a good time to place a net over it to catch any falling leaves.

On-street pay and display parking machines now switched off



As many of you now know, the Council has discontinued its on-street pay and display machines because they operated on the 3G mobile phone network, which is being shut down across the country, making them increasingly costly to maintain and replace.

This removal programme means that all on-street pay and display machines in chargeable locations have now been switched off and so cannot be used. The full system for previously free locations without Pay and Display machines (e.g. Sanderstead) and those that previously had 1 hour free P&D machines (e.g. Selsdon) went live with new tariffs on 29th July. You will not be charged for the free period by the council but you must register your parking through one of the three systems given below:

(1) The RingGo parking app.

The app is free to use on both Apple and Android devices. Where free parking tariffs apply these will still be available through the app. Other than the name of the person parking and the vehicle registration, personal information such as card details do not need to be stored on the app. While the council does not charge for using RingGo, RingGo makes a charge for the text reminders. You can switch this off in the RingGo settings.

(2) By calling 020 3046 0010.


(3) By paying at any shop that offers PayPoint. When using PayPoint, there is no need to return to the vehicle as the session will automatically start. The paypoint in Selsdon is at Selsdon Food and Wine, directly opposite the Selsdon Baptist Church.

For all these methods of paying there is a grace period up to 10 minutes for organising parking sessions.

Croydon and Livestock!


It may seem hard to believe, especially for our younger readers, but until relatively recently sheep, horses, cows etc. were a common sight in Croydon. For many hundreds of years Croydon was a small self-contained market town with an excellent location between London and the South Coast and proximity to the North Downs (ancient trackway), making it a natural trading post with plentiful clean water and surrounding woodlands. The existing paths, roads and then rail networks enabling animals to be brought in from far and wide for sale. The last Croydon Cattle market was moved to the South Croydon site 'Drovers Road' off Selsdon road in 1848 and was held weekly on a Thursday and only closed in 1936 as the land surrounding Croydon became more residential. According to the South Croydon Allotments history their soil was improved by the manure produced by the Cattle market!

Some may remember that between 1988 and 2002 Selsdon Wood held an annual event, latterly called 'The Croydon Country Show', with various country crafts, activities, shows and animal attractions. These included sheep dogs and heavy horses. Sadly, the popularity of this event caused its downfall due to safety concerns over crowds, damage to the land and escalating costs.

Nowadays (over 20 years later), within walking distance of Selsdon we can still see horses in fields at Heathfield/Bramley Bank near Littleheath Woods or ride them for a charge at Kingsmead Equestrian near Kings Wood or Farleigh Court Equestrian near Selsdon Wood. Cows can be



seen near Farleigh Golf club/Kings Wood. We can even get close to sheep at Heathfield Ecology Centre twice a month. However, if you want to get really close to farm animals then family favourite Godstone Farm, via 409 bus or a short car drive, might be your best bet. Bocketts Farm Park which is further afield is another popular choice. Alternatively, Deen City farm in Merton is accessible via the Croydon Tramline (Morden Hall Park). Crystal Palace Park Farm is a short drive away and has free entry.

However, many young people in Selsdon may have visited small animals closer to home at an organised visit to 'The Arc Centre'. This is an 'animal education centre' based at Greenvale school. They make clear they are not aimed at being a 'petting zoo', rather at teaching children one to one or in organised groups, about how to care for exotic (e.g. meerkats) and domestic animals (e.g. goats).

There is a good news story linking education, Croydon and farm animals that you may not know about. About 15 years ago a man named Jamie Feildon was teaching at, what was then, Haling Park Secondary school and wondered if sharing his family farm in Bath for a short vacation with some of the disadvantaged pupils he encountered would help them overcome some of the challenges they faced. He soon saw that a 'combination of exercise, hard work, fresh air, and very importantly, seeing what a sense of community feels like brought great and lasting benefits to the children'. The school were impressed by his results and helped to fund a larger scheme and subsequently helped him start his charity 'Jamie's farm', which has since expanded to 5 livestock farms with over 2000 young people a year staying for breaks typically those struggling at school. Their wellbeing, engagement, life skills and prospects are improved from what they learn.

It would seem to make sense that looking after or being around animals would teach empathy, responsibility and help to connect people with their environment. Not only that many of our ancestors would have worked with livestock on a daily basis, so being round such animals is a way of connecting with our heritage. Worth the effort to get out and find them!

What's new at Sanderstead Recreation Ground?

If you visited Sanderstead Rec this summer you will have noticed two new and exciting additions to the area, The Hive Design Studio and, more recently, a community table tennis table thanks to the enthusiastic endeavours of the Sanderstead WI table tennis players.



The Recreation Ground was formerly fields belonging to Whitehorse Farm, later Borough Farm. Pre 1914 Sanderstead Village was surrounded by 7 farms owned by the Atwood family. Borough Farm was used mainly as a dairy; its few remaining farm buildings being demolished and a Waitrose store erected on the site in 2004. Sanderstead's main shopping area was built between 1932-1938.

The Hive building started life as a bus shelter and toilet block, I believe it also had an integral small store for the park keeper's equipment. After being repurposed by the Council, it was rented out in 2014 as Priscilla's Tea Room. As well as serving vintage style teas, the owners supported many local charities and organised community activities, including the very successful Sanderstead Community Day on the adjacent Recreation field (which this year will be run by Sanderstead & Selsdon Rotary).

During Covid, Priscilla's adapted to the restrictions by becoming a small "corner shop". Fast forward to today and the building is an exciting Design Studio run by Felicity and Jo, who met in the playground of their children's school and discovered they shared similar interests and ideals, one of which was fund raising for a new trim trail at St. Peter's School. They have transformed the building into a bright and airy space with a pale green and cream décor and matching furniture adding to the calm and relaxed atmosphere. The 3 adult size tables can accommodate up to 12 participants depending on the needs of the workshop. The building has disability access and toilet plus a fenced off outdoor space that can be used for children's parties.

There is a cornucopia of workshops on offer for all interests and age groups. Tiny Hive offers a weekly drop-in art and craft session for 3+years with their parent or carer - a wonderful way to make those friendships that go on forever. Little Hive offers sessions for 7–11-year-olds, both during the school holidays and after school. This summer's school holiday programme included workshops by local children's illustrator Ciara Flood

Here one of our residents responds to a letter in the July edition about whether the use of drones can be considered as trespass.

Dear Editor.

I respond to Andy Simpson's letter about a drone published in your July issue. Informing local residents of their "rights" is a laudable aspiration, but care should be taken to ensure that information is accurate and relevant.

Trespass: Generally, this is a civil tort which is only enforced by the police in very specific definitions – which this example does not appear to fulfil. In the case quoted, unless the drone was being used in a clearly dangerous way or as an aid to a separate criminal offence - voyeurism, for example - involving the police might be considered to be unnecessarily distracting them from rather more important duties. Specifically, conducting a survey with a drone does not appear to constitute an offence.



Relevant Authorities: Although not stated, one presumes Andy means the Civil Aviation Authority? There are some differing regulations regarding drones, particularly with regards to their weight being over, or under, 250g. Drones should normally be flown under 400ft altitude, but a minimum height is not specifically stated, creating a grey area. Whilst it is advised that permission be sought prior to filming where feasible, this is another rather grey area too. Have you been asked if you object to your property being on Google Earth?

With regards to operation by an "estate agent" – suggesting a possible commercial use - illegalities or oversights might include, not being registered with the CAA as an operator, possible breaches of the data controller regulations, a failure to carry public liability insurance cover and possible data protection considerations. It seems possible that these would need to be addressed to the relevant specific authorities rather than the police. However, unless such behaviour became repetitive or particularly intrusive, similar to many neighbourly contretemps, a non-confrontational resolution might be more sensible. Beware! Insisting on "rights" can often result in very substantial expenditure.

I am neither an Estate Agent nor do I have any connection with drones, or their operation.

Here a resident reports a safety issue in Littleheath Woods.

Dear Editor,

On Saturday 10th August, I was walking my dog through Littleheath Woods. After a few minutes, I noticed shards of glass and ceramic on the path. Each shard was around an inch square with sharp edges. I found a mixture of clear, blue and brown glass, and various ceramics. There was a sparse covering of around 5-10 shards per square metre. The coverage was extremely consistent and could be found on most paths within the woods.

The consistency of the shards' dimensions and their broad uniform coverage indicates they were deliberately spread. I cannot fathom why someone would have done this. The sharp glass poses a clear risk

to dogs, who I speculate may have been the target. The glass also endangers children who may fall on the path.

I have attached a photograph of a selection of glass and ceramic shards that I have collected. There were thousands of shards spread across hundreds of metres of path, so I was unable to make the woods safe.

The glass will now permanently be part of the ecology of the woods. I hope whoever spread this glass understands the danger they pose to animals and children.

I received this cautionary letter from a resident about falling for a scam. Dear Editor,

I have always thought that I was too careful to be scammed, but I was wrong. I wanted to share my story with your residents so they do not get duped like me.

I was on holiday when I received a call (07... number) from a charming chap purporting to be from HSBC Fraud Department. He told me that there had been two purchases made from my account in the Manchester area and, as I live in South Croydon, he wanted to know whether they were legitimate. I told him that they were not and he said he would block them. I was still wary about the call and was determined not to give him any information. However, he then quoted my bank sorting code, the last four digits of my card number, my email address and my mobile number, and he asked me to confirm them. As he had so much information about me, I began to trust the call. This was a big mistake, as I later realised, as we so often give this information when we pay for something online and this can be passed on to criminals.

For further confirmation, he then asked me roughly how much was in the account. I felt uncomfortable about this and said I did not know and ended the call. He rang again and said for him to cancel the payments I needed to be on the line. Over the next couple of minutes, he counted down the completion of the task -50%, 75%, 100% done. He then said I would receive a text confirming what he had done and, in the text, would be a number that I needed to give him so he could confirm that I had received the text. I told him that I had received a text and, again, I ended the call.

At this point I must explain that I was on holiday, in a restaurant and my dinner had been served. I felt under pressure and the caller was very persistent. I then made my biggest mistake. When he rang again, I had looked at the number in the text, but had not read the text. I gave him the 'confirmatory' number and then the call ended.

I immediately rang the phone number on my bank card to confirm that this chap had been from their Fraud Department. They told me that he was not and a payment for £500 was due to be taken from my account. Luckily, they could still block this as I had called them so quickly. They told me that they would never call me by phone to discuss a suspicious bank transfer. When I looked at the text that the fraudster had sent me, I realised that the

'confirmatory' number had been a one-time password for a bank transfer.

I felt such a fool after this event but I wanted to share it with your readers so that they do not fall foul of this scam. I had a very lucky escape.

FLY'S EYE VIEW

The fly flew towards the vast expanse of white, imagining himself to be exploring Antarctica in the frozen footsteps of Scott and Amundsen.

After taking a turn or two to survey the terrain he landed softly – upside down – as you do down under. The surface proved surprisingly warm and rough – no soft snow or slippery ice – just a newly painted Artex ceiling.



Nature Notes from Ted Forsyth Elusive Butterflies

We usually expect to see butterflies fluttering over fields of flowers and grasses but there are exceptions to this general trend. The large and spectacular Silver-washed Fritillary can be seen visiting flowers such as those of bramble but its life cycle is tied to trees as it lays its eggs in the cracks in the bark and often feeds on the honeydew left by aphids at the tops of trees. White Admiral has similar sorts of habits in that it will feed on honeydew and visit brambles but for egg laying it prefers wispy bits of honeysuckle.

A small number of other butterfly species are even more closely associated with trees so that to catch a glimpse of them it might be necessary to spend time peering at the foliage, perhaps with the help of binoculars. White-letter Hairstreaks are generally found at the tops of Elm trees but will come down to nectar on suitable flowers. I have seen large numbers feeding on Goldenrod in High Elms in Bromley.

Purple Hairstreaks are associated with Oak trees. When I had an Oak not far from a bedroom window, I was able to watch at eye level as the insects walked over the leaves. Even from the ground it is possible to see this movement as reflected light flashes from the pale underside of

the butterfly's wings. Butterflies prefer warmth but when the temperature becomes too high, they will seek cooler conditions. This was evident in 2023 when a colleague doing a transect count, found more than 100 Purple Hairstreaks resting on vegetation at low level. When a butterfly emerges from the pupa it has to expand the wings by pumping fluid through them. Occasionally this does not work properly, leaving a crumpled wing, and we have sometimes found such a specimen on the ground.

Brown Hairstreak males congregate at the top of a locally prominent Oak or Ash where they are visited by females. The females will then fly off to look for a suitable Blackthorn bush on which to lay their eggs. As this occurs in late summer or early autumn there is not enough time for caterpillars to emerge, find suitable food, pupate and complete their life cycle, so the eggs remain on the bush



throughout the winter. As the males are virtually invisible at the tree tops, and females are widely dispersed, the best way to determine the presence of this species on a site is to search for the eggs in the middle of winter.



Green Hairstreak differs in laying its eggs on a wide range of ground plants rather than on trees. In the pupal stage the pupa can make an audible sound when disturbed and can also emit a pheromone – both of which attract the attention of Red Ants which will take the pupa into their nest and care for it, until the butterfly emerges in April. An adult male will maintain a territory and will

perch on a prominent twig on a hedge from which it will fly out to chase females or intruding males before returning to its perch. There is also a Black Hairstreak but it is restricted to a few sites and does not breed near Selsdon Wood.

The Purple Emperor is not part of the Hairstreak group but has a similar liking for the tops of trees. The males form a lek as they congregate at the top of a master tree, usually a tall Oak, from which they emerge to have aerial battles or to chase females. Males will come down to ground level to acquire mineral salts from a range of sources including carrion, animal faeces, or even a muddy puddle. The female lays her eggs on Goat Willow or related species.
