
## **Christopher Sadler**

There is a record of the Christening of Christopher Sadler in Sutton in Ashfield, Nottinghamshire on 19<sup>th</sup> July 1812. His parents are named as Samuel and Elizabeth Sadler. Sutton in Ashfield is in the Registration District of Mansfield so that is where his birth would have been registered.

By the time of the 1841 census, Christopher was married to Charlotte, with 2 children and living in Selsdon. 1841 was the date of the first full census of England and the data collected was less detailed than in later censuses. There is no full detail of place of birth, just a Y/N as to whether the person was born in the same county as s/he now lives. Both children were born in the same county )ie Surrey) which suggests that Christopher and his wife moved to Selsdon soon after their marriage and before they started their family.



Most 1841 records do show a full address under PLACE but this one has no detail listing several pages of names (approximately 100 people) under the place name 'Lodge' or 'Selsdon' or "Croydon (Parish of)'. All those listed on these pages were 'Agricultural Labourers', 'Farmers', or Male or Female Servants. This suggests that the cottages inhabited by all those who worked for the estate did not have proper addresses at that time.

The Sadler record is at the bottom of the first page and breaks over the page with young Charles listed at the top of the next column.

Later censuses show that Christopher's wife Charlotte also came from Nottingham. We cannot know why they would leave the area to come to Croydon. However, there is a probable record of their marriage in Marylebone in June 1838. The Free BMD record listing gives only the names of all those married in the June quarter (ie April-June) of 1838 – without showing who married whom. To get this information it is necessary to send for a full marriage certificate which costs £10. However, there is a Charlotte on this list and it seems likely that Christopher was married to Charlotte Stocks.

Indeed, a record can be found in the 'London, England Church of England Marriages and Banns' of a marriage between Christopher and Charlotte on April 3<sup>rd</sup> 1838 in St Mary's Church, Marylebone, Middlesex. At the time of their marriage Christopher was recorded as living in Portman Square and Charlotte in Croydon. It is notable that both bride and groom 'made their mark' on the register (as opposed to signing) which suggests that both were illiterate, as were most people at that time.

Charlotte was living in Croydon at the time of the marriage. Perhaps her family had come here first and Christopher came south to join her.

By the 1851 census the Sadler family had grown. Again, there is no proper address on the record – this is simply stated as 'Cottage.'

By 1861 George, Charles and Elizabeth had left home, James was working as a Garden Boy and a further daughter, Anne, had been born. However, John, who would have been 11 years old, is not shown on the record. Although the age is not given on this record it seems a probable death of baby John during the September quarter (July, Aug, Sept) of his second

year. (The 1851 census was conducted in March.) The loss of a child was not uncommon at that time but would have been felt just as deeply.

By 1871 all the children had flown the nest but Christopher and Charlotte were still living in the cottages. These were now numbered and they lived at no. 4. The Lover family were close neighbours at no. 1 (see below).

The 1881 record is virtually identical although again the cottages are not numbered. This suggest that the numbering in 1871 was given by the census enumerator rather than representing a true address.

By 1891 Christopher was a widower, living with his housekeeper Lucy Cooper. Charlotte had died, aged 75, in the second quarter of 1888.

## **James Lover**

Unlike Christopher Sadler, James Lover was a local boy born and bred.

His Baptism is recorded in the Parish of Farley on 17<sup>th</sup> January 1813.

In the 1841 census he was listed as an Agricultural Labourer on the Selsdon estate. His listing is on the page adjacent to the one where Christopher Sadler is shown and also lacks any detailed address.

Unlike Christopher, James is not listed with any family members but amongst a group of other single males so he was probably unmarried at that time.

However by 1851 he was married with 4 children. Again he is recorded on an adjacent page to the Sadlers. They were close neighbours and they, and their children, must have known each other well

One wonders why baby William is living with the Lovers.

As he is listed as nephew to James, his surname gives a clue to Sophia's maiden name and enables us to find the marriage with confidence. James married Sophia Burnel in Bromley in the third quarter of 1844.

By 1861 the eldest son William has left home and nephew William Burnel is no longer with the family – suggesting that his stay in 1851 may have been temporary. Perhaps Sophie was babysitting for her brother.

There are 3 more children, two sons and a daughter.

The Sadler family appears on the same page – only 4 households away from the Lovers.

In the 1871 record there are some confusing changes of name. James' name is now given as William and Thomas' as George. These two birth records confuse matters still further. If George and Thomas are different children where was George in 1861.

In 1891, George seems to have returned to the family home. Where was he in 1881 and why did he return? Emily has moved away (probably married) but there is now a 9 year old 'boarder' called Thomas Holloways. Who is he and why is he living with the Lovers?

James Lover did not make the next census. He died in the second quarter of 1898 aged 85. His burial is recorded in the Parish of Addington on 13<sup>th</sup> May.

His wife survived him for only 3 years – her burial is recorded on March 23<sup>rd</sup> 1900. Although she is buried in Addington with her husband, her address is given as South Norwood – she may well have gone to live with one of her children after her husband died.
